ENTIRE ART COLLECTION OF FOLK ART INTERNATIONAL RESOURCES FOR EDUCTION OF SAN FRANCISO TO GO ON THE AUCTION BLOCK!

The February 7 auction is the entire art collection of Folk Art International Resources for Education (FAIRE) of San Francisco. This collection is being sold to benefit FAIRE¹s projects and programs.

In the collection are over 750 masks, figures, and paintings from the ethnic cultures of Africa, Asia, Oceania and the Americas. They were gathered by the late Raymond G. Handley (1923-2009), a peninsula real estate mogul and world traveler. He had eclectic taste and acquired great quantities of old and new tribal art from around the world.

In the 1970s Mr. Handley envisioned opening a public museum in the Bay Area presenting what he preferred to call his collection of ³international folk art² -- meaning objects made for and used by indigenous people, usually in a village context. The museum did not materialize, but he and his talented staff developed a popular program for the study of folk art in Northern California schools that flourished from 1982 to 2008. As teaching aids, the educators created traveling showcases with objects from the collection that brought the actual art of mysterious cultures into the classrooms.



In the later years Mr. Handley enlarged the concept to encompass fine art and antiquities. For example included the sale are intricate Indian temple carvings. But the most of the items up for sale are artworks of "the folk".
